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My freshmen year of college was my hardest and loneliest time in my life. My mom had just moved to Arizona, my twin sister and friends moved away for college, I just went through a hard break up, and I was on my own. As a result, I tried to fill the emptiness I was feeling by running to alcohol, drugs, and other guys. In the moment it helped and I enjoyed it, but it would always leave me more empty and the pain and loneliness was still there.

This fall I filled out a survey that Cru had where students could answer questions about God and had the opportunity to meet up with someone to talk more. I had a lot of questions and wanted to learn more, so when Kimmie texted me to meet up, I decided to take that step. We ended up talking for over an hour together about where I stand in my faith. Kimmie asked if I had a personal relationship with God and she ended up sharing the gospel with me. I had heard parts before and was familiar with some of the bible verses she shared, but that was the first time I think I really heard and understood what Jesus did for me on the cross and God's plan and purpose.

After that conversation, I started attending Cru at Bismarck State College and learning more about God's love and meeting others who were in a similar spot. I also started going to a bible study and meeting up with Kimmie and a couple of others girls to help me grow more in my faith. The fall semester was such a fun and exciting time for me. I started making friends through Cru who were positive influences in my life and really cared about me. It was after a weekend retreat, called Fallapalooza, that I really started wanting to read the bible on my own. I just couldn't get enough and it was so real and applied to my life. I was filled with so much peace and joy in Christ that I would have never thought I would experience. My life and reason for living was changing.

Towards the end of the semester, I heard about another Cru conference called TCX. Money was tight and I was already working two jobs and I really did not want to spend New Year's apart from my twin. I started praying about it and I asked if my sister would come with me. Her faith was not strong at the time, but she said she would go if I paid for her. However, I knew I did not have the money for both of us to go, but then God answered my prayer and he provided in an amazing way. One of the staff told me that they never want money to be the reason someone would miss out and that there was scholarship money available for this exact reason. The morning we were leaving for the conference, at the last minute we

almost backed out because of fear, but we made it and it was an incredible experience. We were surrounded by so many college students who loved God and wanted to live for Him. The worship and speakers were so awesome and I learned a lot from them. I remember one talk specifically, where I realized that there were ways I was living and choices I was making that were hurting my relationship with God. I felt guilt and shame, but I was hit by the love of Christ and His forgiveness and that he wants so much more for my life. One of the days we went out and gave food to people in need and had opportunities to share our faith. I left that conference on fire for God and wanting to share Him with others.


I am continually reminded how much I need Jesus and that He is always with me even when I mess up. I want others to know the hope and love of Christ that I never knew existed.
